The goal of the Court Advocacy Program at the H.E.R. Shelter is to work conjunctively with appropriate community resources so that all clients receive the highest service possible. These services may include:

- Assistance in understanding how to use the legal tools that are available to clients for their protection, i.e., Protective Orders
